

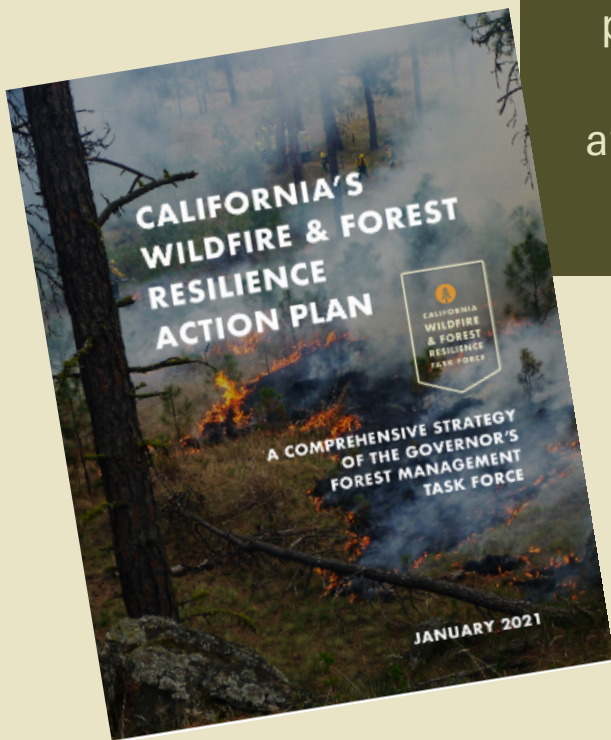

What is the California Wildfire & Forest Resilience Task Force?

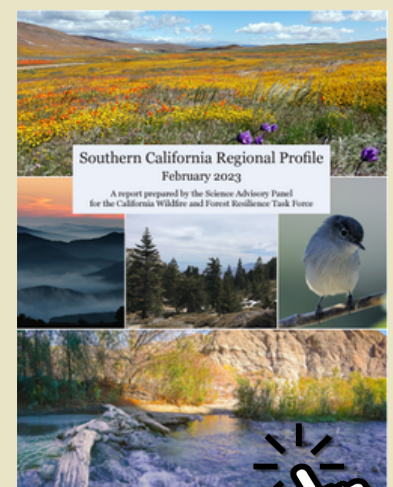
The Task Force is a collaborative effort to align the activities of federal, state, Tribal, local, public and private organizations to support programs and projects tailored to regional priorities and risks, and to bring the best available science to wildlands management and community protection efforts.



One mechanism to accelerate efforts that support healthier forests, fire adapted communities, and the economies of rural forested areas is the Task Force's Action Plan.

To achieve the goals of the Action Plan, the Task Force developed frameworks to mobilize regional assessments of landscape conditions and project planning. These frameworks include a Regional Profile, which describe socio-ecological context, and a Regional Resource Kit for each of the four regions across California.

## Framework for Resilience Hierarchy

### PILLARS

The desired long-term, landscape-scale, outcomes of restoring resilience

### ELEMENTS

The primary processes and functions that together make a pillar

### METRICS

Used to assess, plan, measure, and monitor progress towards outcomes

### CORE REPORTING METRICS

Not the same as metrics.

Subset of metrics used to evaluate the outcomes of work completed.

## What is a decision-support tool?

A decision-support tool is a science-based resource that quickly analyzes and evaluates large amounts of spatial, quantitative, and qualitative data to provide potential management options. Examples include [Planscape](#), [ForSys](#), and [PROMOTe](#).
